
As we think of growing in our faith and in the knowledge of Christ

News of former staff member:

We have received word of the death of the Reverend Larin R. Kerr on January 28, 2017. Larin served as the Minister of Christian Education and Youth Pastor at First Baptist from 1971-73. Before coming to Dover, he and his wife, Julie, had served as missionaries to the Hopi people in Polacca, AZ and Navajo people in Keams Canyon. In 1973, Larin, Julie, and their five children returned to the mission field serving the Crow (Apsalooka) Tribe at Burgess Memorial Baptist Church, Crow Agency, MT for eight years and the Rainy Mountain Kiowa Indian Baptist Church, Mountain View, OK for eighteen years before retiring due to ill health. Larin is survived by his wife, Julie, their five children, eighteen grandchildren, and twentyseven great-grandchildren. If you would like to contact Julie, call the church office for her address.
