## From the Pastor's Desk Reverend Daniel Taylor

As we turn the calendar to March we are already three Sundays into the season of Lent and we are on a Journey to the Cross as we move towards Easter in just a few short weeks. This journey has taken us with Jesus through temptation, a challenge to follow and will be faced with greed, sacrifice and praise in the coming weeks before we walk with Jesus to the Cross. Lent is a period leading to Easter that allows each of us to look more closely at our own relationship with Christ and the love and sacrifice God made on our behalf. Holy Week – the time between Palm Sunday and Easter – is a special time of reflection for each of us and a service on Maundy Thursday will fill be a time of inspiration as we look to Easter.

Along our way this month we will also have a guest who will join us on Sunday, March 18, to help us learn more about the ministry we share as American Baptists across the United States and Puerto Rico



through the American Baptist Home Mission Societies. It is a privilege for us to welcome the **Rev. Lisa Harris Lee**, Director of Mission Engagement and National Network Initiative, who will share with us and help lead in worship. Lisa is a personal friend and has been with us two other times in the past few years. She headed the Children in

Poverty project coming in that capacity and returned for the special pastoral installation service in November 2014.

She will particularly promote the American for Christ Offering as we are highlighting it throughout the month of March. The AFC Offering goal for our congregation this year is \$3100. I hope you will make sure you worship with us on March 18 to hear Rev. Harris Lee and during Lent.

Dear Church Family and Friends,

## *“The Entrance of Jesus To Our Lives”*

The Holy Week is upon us once again. It is a good time to pause and reflect about our life.

Was Jesus a fool when He entered Jerusalem on Palm Sunday or the Triumphant Entry, knowing that it would lead to His death?

On the contrary, Jesus entered with the full knowledge that His entrance will cause an uproar that will lead to His arrest and execution. Nevertheless, Jesus did it for our own sake.

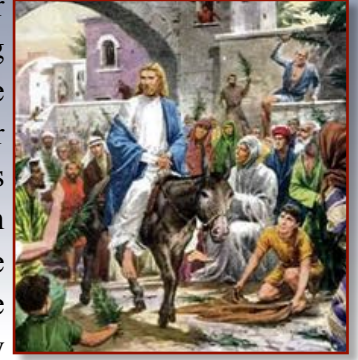
Will we let Jesus have a triumphant entry in our lives? The entrance of Jesus teaches us two things.

*First* – His entrance to our lives will lead to our cleansing. The entry of Jesus into Jerusalem led him to the temple in which he subsequently cleansed it by overturning the tables of the corrupt businessmen who were in connivance with the corrupt priests. For sure, there will be an upheaval within us when we let Jesus enter. Maybe some of us will not like His entrance and like the Pharisees, Priests, and Sadducees of olden times will plot for His demise in our lives. Or some of us will get angry like the moneychangers whom Jesus called thieves and robbers because of our corrupt ways. But hopefully, most of us will allow Jesus to cleanse the temple of our lives of any unclean practices.



*Second* – His entrance to our lives will teach us how to live humble lives. Amidst the chaos of Roman occupation, and the constant clamor of people for salvation from foreign domination, Jesus rode a donkey (a symbol of peace and humility) and not a horse (a symbol of war and success).

In the midst of our horsepower-driven society, we sometimes forget to acknowledge God as the source of everything. When we make ourselves as the center or the starting point of our successes, we are committing the sin of pride. Let us be reminded that the center letter of the word sin and pride is “I”. There is an illustration that tells about the story of the donkey that Jesus rode. The donkey was so fascinated by the event of the triumphant entry that he excitedly told his mother later that the people were praising him and extolling his humble virtues. His mother wanted to teach him a lesson about humility. So she asked him to ride the trail again all by himself. The result, the donkey went home unhappy and learned his lesson: “We are nothing without Christ.”

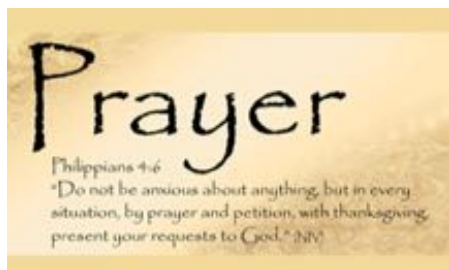
# Board of Missions

## *in between*

March seems to be that in-between time of winter and spring. There are more warm days than cold, but snow is still never out of the picture. Spring officially starts on the 20<sup>th</sup>. The garden still must wait for at least one more month. Will it come in like a lamb and out like a lion, or the other way around. How will March Madness turn out? James 5:7 “Be patient, then, brothers and sisters, until the Lord’s coming. See how the farmer waits for the land to yield its valuable crop, patiently waiting for the autumn and spring rains.” We are in that ‘between’ time...

We are also in that between time of Ash Wednesday and Easter. In that 40-day period of waiting, looking forward to the resurrection. As you prepare for Easter, think more about the act of love that God made than the Easter bunny and eggs. Think more about the pain and torture on that Good Friday than the meal you will share with family on Easter Sunday. Think about the true sacrifice of God’s love recognizing that any sacrifice we may have made during this time - some people do not eat meat on Friday. **Focus on Easter.**

We are also in that in-between time in our life and also waiting on the 2<sup>nd</sup> coming. In our life, we have many days behind us and still more to come. We have a history of the things we have done, and even maybe regrets of things we wish we could have done better. We have family, we have work accomplished and other things we have done with our lives. We may have plans for the future or unsure what the future will bring.

We are also in that in-between time waiting on Jesus’ return. We wait for the sky to be opened wide and His returning to take His people up before the time of trial. We don’t know when this will happen, so we must always be prepared. Matthew 24:42-44 (NIV) “Therefore keep watch, because you do not know on what day your Lord will come.



But understand this: If the owner of the house had known at what time of night the thief was coming, he would have kept watch and would not have let his house be broken into. So, you also must be ready, because the Son of Man will come at an hour when you do not expect him.”

And we all are in the in-between time as we wait; Revelation 21:3-4 (NIV) “And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, “Look! God’s dwelling place is now among the people, and he will dwell with them. They will be his people, and God himself will be with them and be their God. ‘He will wipe every tear from their eyes. There will be no more death or mourning or crying or pain, for the old order of things has passed away.”

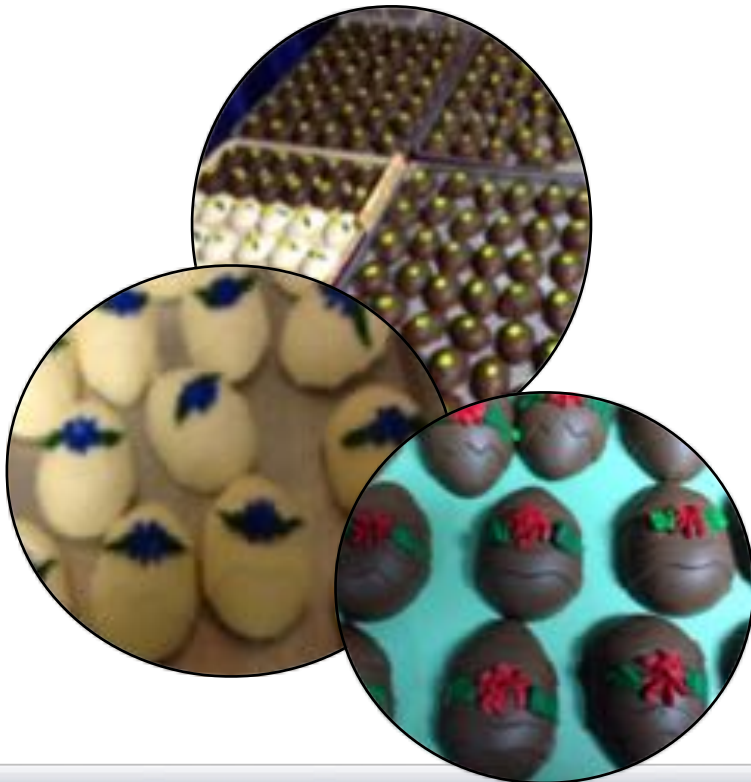


**Mark your calendar for this exciting trip through the Bible. March 6, 10:00 at Jo Rolison’s home.**
