### **Conscience and Holy Spirit**

### What is Conscience?

Conscience is an inner feeling or voice viewed as acting as a guide to the rightness or wrongness of one's behavior. It is a sense of right and wrong. It is that part of human that



gives rise to mental sorrow and guilty feelings when we fail to comply with it and feelings of pleasure and satisfaction when we do not violate it. *Suneidesis* is the Greek word for conscience in the New Testament and it means "moral consciousness" or "moral awareness." There is no Hebrew term for conscience.

#### **Functions of Conscience**

God has placed conscience in our hearts to know the difference



between right and wrong, good and evil. In Acts 23:1, 24:16, and I Corinthians 4:4, apostle Paul refers to his conscience as he examined his words and deeds and found them to conform

to his morals and value system, and most importantly, to **God's** standard.

Conscience is a witness to something. In Romans 2:14-15, Paul says that the Gentiles' consciences bear witness to the presence of the law of God in their hearts even though they do not have the Mosaic Law. In Romans 1:9, Paul uses his conscience as a witness that he speaks the truth. Paul also says in II Corinthians 5:11 that his conscience tells him that his deeds are apparent to both God and the witness of other men's consciences.

Conscience is a servant of the individual's value system. A weak conscience is a result of an immature or weak value system while a strong



sense of right and wrong is a result of fully informed value system. A misunderstanding of God's Word can produce a feeling of guilt and shame. A maturing faith strengthens the conscience. Paul talks about this when he gave instructions about eating food sacrificed to idols. He reasoned that since idols are not real gods, it makes no difference whether the food has been sacrificed to idols or not. The problem in some immature believers of the Corinthian church is that they

believed that the idols are real gods and they are horrified at the thought of eating food sacrificed to idols. Because these immature believers weak consciences, Paul encourages those mature believers not to eat food that



have been sacrificed to idols because it would cause the consciences of the weaker brothers to condemn their actions. Those that have clear consciences because of the matured faith should not cause those with weaker consciences to stumble by exercising the freedom that comes with a stronger conscience. Is Conscience always reliable to guide us on what is right and what is wrong?



1 Timothy 4:1-2 states "The Spirit clearly says that in later times some will abandon the faith and follow deceiving spirits and things

taught by demons.<sup>2</sup> Such teachings come through hypocritical liars, whose consciences have been seared as with a hot iron." In verse 2, Paul talks about consciences that have been seared as with hot iron. Seared conscience is calloused and hardened. It no longer feels anything. It cannot be a reliable

barometer for right and wrong. A person with a seared conscience will do something wrong and deceives him/herself into thinking that all is well with his/her soul, and treat others without sensitivity and compassion.

## If conscience is not always a reliable guide for right and wrong, what is or who is?

"But the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you all things and will remind you of everything I have said to you." John 14:26. The phrase "he shall teach you all things" covers the teaching of what is right and what is wrong. And in John 16:13, "But when he, the Spirit of truth, comes, he will guide you into all the truth. He will not speak on his own; he will speak only what he hears, and he will tell you what is yet to come." The phrase "he will guide you into all truth" includes the Holy Spirit guidance on

what is right and what is wrong.

The Holy Spirit, the promised gift of God the Father, will not guide anybody contrary to what



the Word of God teaches. As followers of Christ, we must allow the Holy Spirit to guide us into the things of God. The final judge of all truth must be the Word of God and not our consciences. King David had the prophet Nathan but we have the Holy Spirit.
