

What if Jonah had listened? What if, on first request, Jonah had listened to God and addressed the people of Nineveh concerning their need to repent? He would have avoided stormy ride on a boat, an unplanned dip in the sea and what had to be both an unforgettable and unwanted vacation in the digestive tract of a sea dwelling creature. Additionally, the people of Nineveh may have heard God's message sooner and perhaps a person or two would have been reached in time for them to repent before standing in judgment before their Creator.

On the other hand the men Jonah encountered on his journey on the boat would not have been exposed to what ended up being an extraordinary, perhaps life changing event, and nobody would have witnessed Jonah's inexplicable state following his time spent in the belly of a fish. Almost assuredly the disobedience of Jonah altered the course of history and ended up having an impact both on his message, and the people that message would reach.

The story of Jonah is often invoked to demonstrate God's ability to work through flawed folks, and his patience in the face of our disobedience, but have you ever stopped to consider that it speaks to the nature of the past. It's less important to contemplate what might have been had Jonah initially responded to God's call than it is to understand the grace that was revealed when he ultimately answered the call. As with Jonah, so with us. Where we have been to this point in our lives is insignificant when compared to where we are headed. Each day presents us with a new opportunity to hope, strive and serve. Dwelling on past failures only limits what we can achieve in the future, and with a proper perspective our past can serve as a valuable tool from which to grow as opposed to being an anchor which prohibits our journey to becoming a new creation. In the end Jonah serves to remind that good, bad or indifferent, it's not where we've been that is most important in our walk of faith, but rather where we're willing to go.



BOARD OF TRUSTEES


LIGHTING

How do you fix a broken pizza?




