"Love God With <u>ALL</u> Our Being"

In one instance, a member of the church congregation asked a question "What does it mean to love God with all our heart, with all our soul, with all our mind, and with all our strength?" The church member was referring about the answer of Jesus to a teacher of the Law in Mark 12:30 - "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength."

To love God with all our heart means that our desire, affection, and yearning in life must be focused on God. Our heart is the control center of our whole being. The passion to do something comes from the heart. Our desire for God's presence must lead us to worship God in a local church. Our yearning to be intimate with God should lead us to read the Bible. Our affection should also be on things that God wants us to be devoted to.

To love God with all our soul means that our life purpose must be in pursuit of what is heavenly and eternal. Soul is what gives us life. God breathed and we became a living soul. This soul will separate from our physical body and

will go to eternity - either in heaven or hell. If we want to spend eternity in heaven, then we must live a heavenly life here on Earth. We must practice our eternity today.

As we all know, the New Year comes with the traditional new year's resolutions. Go on a diet, stop smoking, eat less sugar, etc. - all items that are good for our body.

As Paul wrote to the church in Corinth in 1 Corinthians 6:19-20, "Do you not know that your bodies are temples of the Holy Spirit, who is in you, whom you have received from God? You are not your own; you were bought at a price. Therefore honor God

with your bodies". We are to honor God with our whole body, not just the physical portion. So why are the normal resolutions good for the physical,



because we are made up of the body (physical), mind and soul. So, what can we do for the mind and soul?

This year, make a great resolution – commit to reading your Bible everyday! Pick a time that you can be alone to be with God as He speaks to you through His Word. Would you give up 10-15 minutes everyday to have a better relationship with your Heavenly Father? Sometimes we don't think we know when he is talking to us. *John 10:4*, Jesus teaches, "When he has brought out all his own, he goes on ahead of them, and his sheep follow him because they know his voice." So, how can you know Jesus' voice, read His word. As you know your family's voice, Jesus wants you to be part of His family.

There are many Bible reading plans. In almost every Bible, there is a guide. You may have a Bible app on your phone that you can follow. If you are looking for your first, or a new type, you can look at <u>https://www.biblegateway.com/reading-plans/.</u>

In what ever plan you use, use it, daily. But, not only read it, contemplate/meditate over it, pray on it in your daily prayers. Include the Wednesday prayer list with your daily time which you can pick it up on Wednesday evening prayer and Bible study time, or in the narthex across from the Welcome Center. **Make it a priority**. If you able to do this first thing on the morning so His word can guide you for the remainder of the day.

Let 2018 be the year that you get closer to God through His word!
