by the Stewardship Committee, a narrative budget for the ministries of the First Baptist Church of Dover for 2018 and a p e r s o n a l i z e d commitment card were distributed. Those

cards were dedicated as a part of worship on Sunday, November 19.

Throughout the Fall empty boxes, wrapped in Christmas paper, were picked up in the Narthex and when they were returned they were filled with toys and gifts for boys and girls. On Sunday, November 12, 101 filled boxes were displayed and dedicated.

In 2016, RMMO raised \$1,059,444 and more than 3,443 checks were distributed. Hopper adds, "We hope congregations will be inspired by our theme, 'Generous Congregations'. 



Start making your Christmas's traditions this year. Many younger families have used the *Elf on the Shelf* as the mischievous Elf gets into trouble each night, so the kids look forward into getting up in the morning to see what the Elf did this time. A tradition for us was Hershey Chocolate bars on Christmas Eve morning. If Santa was coming, his elves would leave a chocolate bar on the Christmas tree for each child. I'm sure that each family has their own traditions, if not, change your 'Christmas future' right now to the celebration of the 'Christmas present'. The old cliché of 'the reason for the season', is still true today as it was so many years ago. If it wasn't for celebrating the birth of our savior and Lord, this time of year would just be another cold month looking for the new year. Maybe, this year, you read the Christmas Story to your family and start (or continue) a new tradition for 'Christmas present' to make the future better.

Luke 2

The Birth of Jesus

In those days Caesar Augustus issued a decree that a census should be taken of the entire Roman world. ² (This was the first census that took place while^[a] Quirinius was governor of Syria.) ³ And everyone went to their own

town to register. ⁴ So Joseph also went up from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to Bethlehem the town of David, because he belonged to the house and line of

David.⁵ He went there to register with Mary, who was pledged to be married to him and was expecting a

child. 6 While they were there, the time came for the baby

to be born, ⁷ and she gave birth to her firstborn, a son. She wrapped him in cloths and placed him in a manger, because there was no guest room available for them.

⁸And there were shepherds living out in the fields nearby,

keeping watch over their flocks at night. 9 An angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone

around them, and they were terrified. ¹⁰ But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid. I bring you good news that

will cause great joy for all the people. ¹¹ Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you; he is the

Messiah, the Lord. ¹² This will be a sign to you: You will find a baby wrapped in cloths and lying in a manger."



¹³ Suddenly a great company of the heavenly host appeared with the angel, praising God and saying,

¹⁴ "Glory to God in the highest heaven,

and on earth peace to those on whom his favor rests."

¹⁵ When the angels had left them and gone into heaven,

the shepherds said to one another, "Let's go to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened, which the Lord has told us about."

¹⁶ So they hurried off and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby, who was lying in the manger. ¹⁷ When they had seen him, they spread the word concerning what had been told them about this child, ¹⁸ and all who heard it

were amazed at what the shepherds said to them. ¹⁹ But Mary treasured up all these things and pondered them in

her heart. ²⁰ The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all the things they had heard and seen, which were just as they had been told.
