Now that we can look toward warmer weather, we can also look to the spring rains that will jump start the earth to bring the flowers, grass and trees we will all enjoy. As I write this, we are enjoying a white day, full of snow on the 2nd day of spring. But this is the time of preparation that nature is getting ready for the spring.

We also should be getting prepared for the spring and summer. We need to be planning on how we can spring up and serve people who need help. A couple of the

events we currently support are feeding the men at the Dover Interfaith Mission for Housing (DIMH) and Make a Difference Day. In the past we have



worked with Habitat for Humanity in Frederica.

This year again, we have an opportunity to work with Habitat on their *Faith Build Generosity Challenge*. This will be an interdenominational build with 20 or more churches in our area. We would be obligated to raise \$2500 by June so the project can start. The possible work days right now are Wednesday and Saturday. Not sure when our day(s) will be, but we will need volunteers. We will discuss this more at the April Church Business Meeting on the 18th.

Also, we will also have a Men's Study like we did last year. The tentative kick-off date is May 19th, in the morning. Depending on the material, we can have subsequent evenings like last time that were on Tuesday evenings. More information will be coming.

"What Jesus Died For"

In our lifetime we have encountered and will encounter many heroes. They are real flesh and blood like us. They were inspired by someone or something, and they gave their life for a cause. But long before them, there was Jesus who gave his life for our salvation. Jesus was actually executed as a rebel. This means that his death was not just a spiritual matter. It also had a political dimension. What did Jesus die for aside for the remission of our sins and the salvation of our souls? What are the things that he stood for? Let me suggest and mention a few.

\mathcal{A} – Jesus was against anyone or anything that hinders people from achieving a meaningful life.

In John 10 Jesus describes himself as a good shepherd. A shepherd is not someone who just stand by and watch. A shepherd not only leads the sheep to green pastures and still waters but also fights the wolves and robbers that would try to harm or take the sheep. As Christians, we need to lead people towards a meaningful life and that involves identifying and fighting the "wolves" that hinder us from having it.

\mathcal{B} – Jesus fought for freedom.

The Israelites during Jesus' time were under the Roman Empire. When Jesus preached about the Kingdom of God, he was telling everyone that the reign of God is better than the emperor of the Roman Empire or the leadership of the Israelites. The Roman Empire and the Israelite leadership were enslaving the people in many ways. Jesus taught that the only way to be free is to accept the reign of God in their lives.

As Christians, we need to fight any form of slavery and proclaim that God is on the side of those who fight for freedom because God wants us all to be free.

C - Jesus empowered the marginalized.

A lot of powerful people were angry with Jesus. When Jesus overturned the tables of the merchants and priests in the Temple who were overcharging and exploiting the

people, he was empowering those who were in the margins of society. In turn, he got the ire of powerful people and he was marked for execution.



As Christians, we need to stand for what is right and we need to be angry if there is any form of exploitation. And if there is a need for it, we are to sacrifice our lives for the cause of Jesus.



Prayer Chain Update




Change in protocol for the Prayer Chain


