From the Pastor's Desk Reverend Daniel Taylor





The month of July comes to us with a bang – literally – as we mark the 242nd year since the Continental Congress voted on the Declaration of Independence separating the colonies from Britain. It wasn't the end of conflicts but

really a beginning of more intense hostilities that continued until the surrender of the British at Yorktown in 1781 and a formal treaty in 1783. The fireworks we enjoy help to remind us of the hard-fought battles for freedom that those colonists endured against the tyranny of the British rule.

As we approached the celebration this year those freedoms were challenged in different ways along the southern U.S. borders. As folks fleeing tyranny were crossing the border into the United States they were detained and their children were separated from them. There has been some resolution to that situation but it will take a long time to bring families back together again. There are decisions that need to be made about how we can peacefully and graciously handle the issues of immigration as a nation of immigrants. (You may not know that 8 of the 56 signers of the Declaration of Independence were immigrants, born in Britain.)

The unanimous Declaration of the thirteen united States of America has these lines as a part of the second paragraph.

We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness.

Scripture tells us ...

There is no longer Jew or Greek, there is no longer slave or free, there is no longer male and female; for all of you are one in Christ Jesus. Galatians 3.28

At the end of the Declaration we find these words.

And for the support of this declaration, with a firm reliance on the protection of Divine Providence, we mutually pledge to each other our lives, our fortunes and our sacred honor.

Scripture tells us ...

All who believed were together and had all things in common; they would sell their possessions and goods and distribute the proceeds to all, as any had need. ... they spent much time ... with glad and generous hearts, praising God and having the goodwill of all the people. Acts 2.44-47a.

We see that our freedoms for whom many died guide us to the freedom we have for which one died for all. We are blessed to have the freedoms of speech and assembly and also the freedom to worship as we please in this country.

Paul tells us in Galatians 5.1 & 13-14 - For freedom Christ has set us free. For you were called to freedom, brothers and sisters; only do not use your freedom as an opportunity for self-indulgence, but serve one another humbly in love For the whole law is summed up in a single commandment, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself."

A noted chaplain of the U.S. Senate, Dr. Peter Marshall, said this – "May we think of freedom, not as the right to do as we please, but as the opportunity to do what is right." Let us use our freedom in Christ to do what is right and love one another and love our neighbors.

We have two ways that we can love our neighbors this Summer. One of those is the **Faith Build** in partnership with the Central Delaware Habitat for Humanity. Through very generous giving we have raised the needed funds for our portion of this project – over \$2375. On one Sunday in July we will welcome Tamara Rodriguez and her children who will be the owners of the new home being built on Kirkwood Street. Volunteers are needed to work on two days in August and to provide lunch on site.

The second opportunity is Vacation Bible School (VBS) that will be held July 29-August 2. Love your neighbors and invite them and their children to join us for that special time of learning about the Bible and growing in faith in Jesus Christ. Let's do what is right and continue to welcome others.


Brayer Chain
