#### Welcome Back Ladies!

The Board has set a busy calendar for the upcoming year. ABWM Sunday is scheduled for September 16<sup>th</sup>. Our guest speaker will be Leslie Turley, Area Director for Southeast Asia & Japan, and former IM missionary to Okinawa. We are excited to have her speak.

This is the second year for our Ministry Focus Theme "Feel/Siente". Our Regional Project this year is **Partnering** *with* **Puerto Rico.** The goal is \$15,000 and the money raised will be used to help rebuild a small rural plant church from the larger city of Gurabo. After Hurricane Maria swept through their country, all that was left of their little church was the concrete bathrooms, and even that had no roof left. This small church, Iglesias Bautistade Masas II, that had been built in 1996, lost everything due to the devastating power of Hurricane Maria. It will take years to rebuild but we are hoping to help give a start. The region is trying to plan a mission trip there in the spring. Look for information, in case you are interested in participating.

I hope you have a wonderful year with the ladies in your circle. Be sure to ask those who are not already part of a circle to join. Offer to pick them up for meetings. harvest you must rest."


What does rest means?

We also need to lighten up and find humor in life. As the


