The FBC COMFORT SHAWL MINISTRY has continued growing this fall, after our summer break. Our monthly gathering in September was a wonderful time of fellowship and showing the beautiful shawls that were stitched by members during the summer months. delivered 25 shawls to the Cancer Unit at Bayhealth in October! Our shawl storage closet is in the conference room outside of the Pastor's study. You are encouraged to pick out a shawl and deliver it to a "deserving "someone you know--illness, bereavement, or celebration. Please sign your name and the name of the shawl recipient on the log-in sheet. Shawls on the shelves are ready for delivery. You may also contact the church or any of the Shawl Ministry members to request a shawl.

We continue to grow in membership and the number of shawls we can stitch. In addition to producing shawls, some members stitch Prayer Cloths and another member is sewing beautiful cloth bags, used to carry a shawl when delivering to a recipient. Embroidered on this lovely white bag are these words: "You are covered in prayer". Also, one of our members has donated cloth printed labels which read:

"Handmade for you Comfort Shawl Ministry First Baptist Church Dover, Delaware"



These labels are hand-stitched to each shawl. In addition to crocheting and knitting shawls, we <u>need new members</u> to join us in stitching labels, sewing fleece shawls, bagging shawls and <u>delivering</u> shawls. So-there is a place for YOU! We meet in the church Fellowship

Hall on the 3rd Monday each month at 1:00 pm. Come when you can-leave when you must. We hope you can join us!

"The Christmas Star"

There is a very interesting prophecy in the Old Testament by a soothsayer from the East named Balaam. The prophecy that includes the story of a star is from Balaam. The Magi knew of this but they were not familiar with Jewish prophecies. This is a reason why they asked where the Messiah would be born. The summoned scribes and priests answered "But you, Bethlehem, though you are small among the clans of Judah, out of you will come one who will be ruler over Israel, whose origins are from of old, from ancient times."

What can we learn from the Magi? Here are four lessons using the acrostic <u>STAR</u>:

Seek - Seek God even if it is difficult.

The Wise Men left the comfort of their homes. They continued to be persistent even if it was uncomfortable. Assuming that the East is Persia or Babylon, then they have to travel about 960 miles. It would take about 30 days of travel by camel if they traveled 32 miles per day. It could be more than 1 month. How about us? Are we willing to get involved in God's ministry even if it would bring personal sacrifices?

Trust the revelations of God even if we do not understand it at the moment. What the Wise Men saw was only a star. But they had faith on what they saw. They traveled based on faith. What about us? What more proofs should we ask from God before we trust Him? The Bible is full of stories that give us proofs that our God is trustworthy. What are the things that are happening in our lives right now that we cannot understand? Surrender our life to God and trust Him.

Allow - Allow detours for it may teach us

valuable lessons. The Wise Men in their detour in King Herod's palace are teaching us about discernment. The Wise Men discerned where to ask questions, and they also discerned the evil intent of King Herod. We should know how to ask the right questions and who to ask. We should always pray that God will endow us with the gift of

discernment so that we may know the character of people who we will meet in our journey.

Remember - Remember that God will always be

there to guide us. God guided the Wise Men through the star. God in the exodus experience also guided the Israelites through a pillar of fire and a pillar of cloud. These are visible reminders that God will find a way to guide us in our lives if we just commit ourselves fully to Him.

May God bless us all as we celebrate a joyful and a Merry Christmas.

Our Lord, Jesus is the reason for this Season.
