From the Pastor's Desk Reverend Daniel Taylor





I have always enjoyed February. I liked February when I was growing up because it would usually snow a lot during that month in West Virginia and there were good chances that we'd have snow days. Also when we were in elementary school it was a month filled with days honoring Presidents Lincoln and Washington and then of course, Valentine's Day. Our mothers would provide

refreshments for a party and in our school we each created a special "Valentine Mail Box" at home. Mom or Dad would usually help with it and we brought it on the day of the party. Oh yes, we also bought special packs ofthose little cards and carefully picked out ones for each of our classmates. Mom made sure I prepared one for each and every person in my class. Of course, extra care was taken for a few of the pretty girls in class (it never helped). We would all go around the room and deliver our cards to the boxes and then later open them carefully to see if there were any special notes included.



Over the years that simple lesson of a card for everyone helped me grasp how much God loves each of us without exception. No matter who, no matter the background, no matter

the language spoken, the economic situation or even the country in which they were born, God loves everyone. The only thing that God asks in return is that we follow the commandment that was affirmed in Luke 10.27 - You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your strength, and with all your mind; and your neighbor as yourself.

Paul wrote this to the Galatians (5.14) For the whole law is summed up in a single commandment, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." It sure sounds easy, but it's difficult to love other people and at times it's especially tough to love ourselves.

At the Annual Meeting of the church last month those gathered affirmed a working draft of a vision statement that will give us lots to work with in the coming days. Coming from both the Great Commandment (shared above) and also the Great Commission (Matthew 28.18-20), the statement is this – **Loving God, Loving People, Making Disciples.** It is a vision to work towards and a small team will be recruited to begin to flesh this out and help all of us understand how we can live it out individually and as a congregation. More about this and how we can show our love for others will be shared in the coming days.

May God surround you with overwhelming love during these days as we worship, learn and serve together.

"Let Us Love Ourselves Also"

Depression is real and a number one factor in suicide.

The Bible teaches us to love God and to love our neighbor as ourselves. Other English Bible translations say, "Love your neighbor as you love yourself." This means that we ought to love ourselves also. Furthermore, this presupposes that we cannot fully love our neighbors if we do not love ourselves.

Does this mean that I have to be egocentric or narcissistic? No. The Bible warns us of this. Paul wrote to Timothy, "... in the last days there will be very difficult times. For people will love only themselves and their money. They will be boastful and proud. They will consider nothing sacred. They will be unloving and unforgiving; they will slander others and have no self-control. They will be cruel and hate what is good. They will betray their friends, be reckless, be puffed up with pride, and love pleasure rather than God. They will act religious, but they will reject the power that could make them godly. Stay away from people like that. Paul also wrote to the Philippian church, "Don't be selfish; don't try to impress others. Be humble, thinking of others as better than yourselves".

What then are some of the things that Bible teaches us how to love ourselves? Let me mention a few.

First - believe that you are created in the image of God.

As such, our lives matter and we have a purpose to fulfill in this lifetime.

Matthew reminds us of our worth in the eyes of God. Jesus said, "And even the very hairs of your head are all numbered. Therefore, don't be afraid; you are worth more than many sparrows." Let us not feel worthless and insignificant. We can also claim the promise of God to Jeremiah (29:11) "For I know the plan I have for you saith the Lord, plan to prosper you and not harm you, plan to give you hope and a future." This wonderful plan is also for each one of us

Second - do not hate yourself but feed and take care of it. Let us watch what we eat, and remember to exercise. We

can observe that it was only recorded once that Jesus rode a donkey. All throughout his life on earth, he was just walking. In Ephesians Paul wrote that Jesus Christ cares for the church because it is His body. In the same manner Paul reiterates that "No one hates his own body but feeds and cares for it..."

In the creation account, God designed us to eat healthy foods; "I give you every seed-bearing plant on the face of the whole earth and every tree that has fruit with seed in it. They will be yours for food...I give every green plant for food." In discussing about food, Paul argues that "Everything is permissible but not everything is beneficial".

May God bless us all as we go out every day determined to love God, love others and love ourselves.

The proceeds from the Easter Egg sales will go, again, to our ABWM of PA/DE regional project. This year we are raising money to rebuild a church that was destroyed in Hurricane María in Puerto Rico. Iglesias Bautista de Masas II Guarabo's congregation of around 20 people live in a small rural area in the mountains of Puerto Rico. Being a new plant from the larger city of Gurabo, they were excited about their new church building on the mountain side. After

Hurricane María swept through their country, all that was left of their little church was the concrete bathrooms, and even that had no roof left. This small church that had been built in 1996 lost everything due to the devastating power of Hurricane María.

The American Baptist Women's Ministries of PA/DE are coming along side to help rebuild their church. The project is going to take many years to complete, because it is a 'from the ground up service project' where everything will have to be replaced. At this time, we are involved with this year only to aid, as a group, financially. There will also be many opportunities to be involved in hands-on teams to Masas.

**Hands-on Mission Opportunities

There are a number on hands-on Missions work trips available through ABCOPAD. Two that are coming up soon are:

Puerto Rico - March 12 - 19, 2019. To assist with the rebuilding of Iglesias Bautista de Masas II - sponsored by the ABWM of PA/DE

Tarboro, NC - March 31 - April 6, 2019. To assist in reconstruction from Hurricane Florence. This is being set up by Calvary Baptist in Newark, DE. Contact person is Melanie Daul, who was a member of our church when living in Dover.
