"Bow Down to Jesus Alone"

Whether we like it or not, the Christmas story has been diluted. We have so many traditions and rituals that are based in the Christmas story but sadly, not Biblical. One of these traditions is the worship of Mary and Joseph. Is this tradition Biblical?

Answering that question leads us back to Matthew 2:11. This verse says, "On coming to the house, they saw the child with his mother Mary, and they bowed down and worshiped him. Then they opened their treasures and presented him with gifts of gold and of incense and of myrrh."

What lessons can we learn from the verse?

First, the verse clearly states that the Magi bowed down

and worshiped Jesus. They did not bow down to Mary, to Joseph, to the animals or to anyone or anything except to Jesus only. The records also show that the Magi did not even bow down to King Herod. We need to check ourselves. Is our worship solely focused on Jesus Christ? Or are we worshipping other people, other things or we bow down to



other things or we bow down to others also? These are difficult questions yet we must answer it.

Lecond, the verse clearly states also that the Magi brought their treasures, and presented their gifts to Jesus. They did not offer the gifts to Mary, Joseph or to others. They did not also present any gifts to King Herod when they passed by Jerusalem.

All of us have been given by God various gifts, and also treasures. Do we offer our gifts to Jesus? Do we offer our treasures to Jesus? For some they offer their gifts to the gods of fame and money. For some they mistakenly offer


their gifts and treasures to religious ministers thinking that it is for God's glory. Let us check ourselves on this.

Definition of commitment per Webster

a: an agreement or pledge to do something in the future *commitment* to improve conditions at the prison *especially* an engagement to assume a financial obligation at a future date

b: something pledged the *commitment* of troops to the war

c: the state or an instance of being obligated or emotionally impelled a commitment to a cause

Being committed in the church can mean even more. Commitment Sunday has already passed where we commit our financial giving for the year to come. Maybe you took an appointment/nomination from the Nominating Committee for next year Going forward to get baptized or join the church is another big commitment. Taking an office in the church, being a teacher, being an usher, trustee, choir, Wednesday evening dinners/prayer & Bible study, and it goes on...

But I really want you to think about what are you committed to do? Do you read your Bible daily? Do you prepare for church on Sunday by praying for the pastor to give his inspired sermon; study your Sunday School lesson as a student or as a teacher; being early to church if you are an usher (by 20 minutes); practicing with the choir on Thursday evening or Sunday evening for Chrysalis; attending the church business meeting; bringing a friend to church; dedicating yourself to God and devoting your time to Him on Sunday?

God committed His Son to live with us on Earth and He taught us so very much. Think where you would be without Jesus coming to earth and teaching us and God giving us His word in the Bible? Jesus committed himself by dedicating His life to teach His disciples, healing the sick and lame, the blind and trying to show people who and how God is. We will be celebrating Jesus' birth this month. Think of His commitment. As the new year is coming rather than making a resolution, make a commitment. Think of at least one commitment you will do this year for God. And do it! Be praying about this commitment, keep it on your mind, speak to the Holy Spirit about it, He will give you the direction. Are you willing to let another year slip by and not committing yourself? What if it is this year that your name is called up yonder, or if He comes back to take us all home?
