5. It is compassionate. We need to care and emotionally support our loved ones.


This kind of love should be demonstrated by us readily, sincerely, humbly, constantly, and creatively.


## It's That Time Again

The ABWM will be taking orders for homemade Chocolate Easter Eggs – February 8th through March 8th. They will, again, be available in the Dark Chocolate, Milk Chocolate or White Chocolate. You will also have a choice of seven (7) different fillings –

Peanut butter, Strawberry cream, Chocolate cream, Orange cream, Buttercream, Coconut cream and Chocolate coconut cream. The cost will remain the same as in previous years: \$2.75 each or Two (2) for \$5.00. The eggs are delicious and freeze well, so that you can enjoy them anytime throughout the year. The proceeds from the Easter Egg sales will go, again, to our ABWM of PA/DE regional project. The regional goal is \$15,000 and is entitled *Brighter Days for Brazilian Youth.* The money raised will help renovate, decorate and open a thrift shop in Vitoria, Brazil. The *thrift shop*, besides providing jobs, will be one more step that leads to self-sustainability for the homeless street children and youth ranging in age from 8 to 18 who are part of a residential program that rescues these children and youth. The program provides guidance, education, and training for future employment. All students have completed a paid internship and are employed before they leave the program. Corenne Smith, Missionary to Vitoria, Brazil, is mainly involved with the older children, working with them on life skills so that they can eventually transition away from a boarding school to independent living. She also serves as a surrogate mother to many of the children, sharing with them the love of Jesus. This Regional Project will assist the poor youth of Brazil.

## HAVE YOU HEARD?

Would you like to save some money on federal taxes? If you are 70 ½ or older you can now make gifts directly from your Individual Retirement Account (IRA) to First Baptist without paying federal income tax on the withdrawal. This provision, called a **Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD),** has been possible for several years but the regulation is usually passed as an added part of the tax law near the end of the calendar year. It was done on a year to year basis. The **Tax Cuts and Jobs Act** passed by Congress in 2017 has made it a

permanent part of the tax code.

### How it works

- You must be age 70  $\frac{1}{2}$  or older at the time the gift is made.
- At age 70  $\frac{1}{2}$  you are required to receive an annual RMD (required minimum distribution).
- Fund received from this distribution are fully taxable.
- You must request from the IRA plan custodian a direct transfer of funds to First Baptist for the gift to be tax free.
- Gifts through a QCD can satisfy part or all of your required distribution.
- Notify your tax preparer of the amount of your which is a charitable gift.

• The account types that are eligible for QCDs include: Traditional IRAs, Inherited IRAs, SEP IRA (inactive plans only and SIMPLE IRA (inactive plans only).
