3 He restoreth my soul: he leadeth me in the paths of righteousness for his name's sake. [Name a time God has restored you – a time when God reached out and brought you back.]

4 Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil: for thou art with me; thy rod and thy staff they comfort me.

[What are you worried about? What "shadows" keep you up at night?]


5 Thou preparest a table before me in the presence of mine enemies: thou anointest my head with oil; my cup runneth over.

[How do you need to be taken care of? How do you want to be loved?]

6 Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life: and I will dwell in the house of the LORD forever.

[What is it you need to empower your faith? What do you need in order to go forward?]

"THE MEANING OF CHRIST'S RESURRECTION FOR US"

If Christ has conquered death, then what does it mean for us?

First, the resurrection of Jesus means that we too can rise above the death-like situations that surround us. Paul affirms that we share in the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ as illustrated in our baptism. If this is so, then we are empowered by God to see life, and make lifeaffirming decisions in seemingly hopeless situations.


Second, the resurrection of Jesus means that the Gospel that we preach is true. In the book of Acts, the word "resurrection" was repeated many times. The disciples were full of courage in preaching the good news about Jesus because of the resurrection. The disciples who were previously scattered and dejected during the arrest and crucifixion of Jesus, were transformed and became bold enough to stand in front of many people declaring that they are followers of Jesus. This was because of one thing alone -- the resurrection of Jesus. This means that we too should not be ashamed in sharing the Gospel because our God is not dead.

Third, the resurrection of Jesus means that we are now bringers of hope. Hope is very powerful as a psychological motivation. How much more if our hope is based on the resurrected Jesus. Our expectation then is full of confidence because "he who began a good work in us will surely bring it on to completion..." (Phil 1:6). Our hope is not just a mere psych ploy, but more importantly a spirituality that is anchored in a certainty. Let us share that hope to others.

And very special thank you to Gene Moore, who has been put to work in many ways, Phil Steinhoff for helping to bag eggs and assemble orders, Lorraine Steinhoff and Cody Leavel for driving to Rehoboth at the last minute to purchase the 34 bags of chocolate we needed to finish making eggs (we couldn't find what we needed in Dover) and for helping to bag eggs and assemble orders, and to Rosemary and George Schuler for helping to assemble the orders. We couldn't have accomplished all of this in such a short time without all the help. This is the largest quantity of eggs we have ever made. Hopefully, the money raised will be of great help to the street kids and their program in Brazil. Definitely a worthy cause! If you missed getting eggs, we will be selling extras when we are back to "normal," which I pray will be sooner than later.

The Board Meeting, scheduled for Tuesday, April 21st is also on hold. I will call you to reset the meeting. Hopefully, we will be able to have our Dinner/Installation in the end of May and will need to meet prior to plan for it.

I pray that this stressful time will be over soon so that we can meet again in May for our Dinner/Installation. Remember to thank God for seeing us safely through this and for His blessings every day and pray for those affected by the Coronavirus and those who have lost loved ones and those who are providing care.



HAVE YOU HEARD?

Would you like to save some money on federal taxes? If you are 70 ½ or older you can now make gifts directly from your Individual Retirement Account (IRA) to First Baptist without paying federal income tax on the withdrawal. This provision, called a **Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD),** has been possible for several years but the regulation is usually passed as an added part of the tax law near the end of the calendar year. It was done on a year to year basis. The **Tax Cuts** and **Jobs Act** passed by Congress in 2017 has made it a

permanent part of the tax code.

How it works

- You must be age 70 ½ or older at the time the gift is made.
- At age 70 ½ you are required to receive an annual RMD (required minimum distribution).
- Funds received from this distribution are fully taxable.
- You must request from the IRA plan custodian a direct transfer of funds to First Baptist for the gift to be tax free.
- Gifts through a QCD can satisfy part or all of your required distribution.
- Notify your tax preparer of your charitable gift amount.
- The account types that are eligible for QCDs include: Traditional IRAs, Inherited IRAs, SEP IRA (inactive plans only and SIMPLE IRA (inactive plans only).


