celebrations will be modified and much smaller in size if not limited to family members. Yes, it will be different this year.

Vacation Bible School was originally on the calendar for late July in the church building as in past years, but now, because of the Coronavirus, it won't be happening. The Board of Christian Education is <u>beginning to</u> <u>explore</u> a new way to share a virtual VBS, but no final plans have been made yet. It will certainly be different. Remember – we've never done it that way before.

For the past four months we have been worshiping together yet in our own homes or wherever we could access the online service. It has been a gift from God that we could still share in worship in such a unique way. It has been a blessing to minister with others who share music and gifts of time and technology to make these weekly services possible. We are all serving together as the hands and feet of Christ.

After much discussion and now that Delaware is in Phase 2 of its reopening, <u>we are planning to welcome</u> you and others back to the sanctuary on Sunday, **July 19 at 11 AM.** We want you to know that every effort is being made to create a safe environment including sanitizing the pews, and surfaces that one would normally touch, and designating seating so that we will be safely distanced from one another as we gather. We will ask that each person coming that day and on subsequent Sundays will wear a mask from the parking lot into the building and during the service, pause for a temperature check as you enter, use hand sanitizer and avoid hand shakes, and hugs. Yes, it will be different and I know that doesn't sound like the fellowship that we had, but It will be so good to be back in the sanctuary together. More information will be coming to you in letters and additional emails in the days ahead. Until then, please continue to join us for worship on *YouTube* at <u>First Baptist Church of Dover DE</u> and if you have access to *Facebook*, join the churches page at <u>First Baptist Church of Dover DE</u>. In the past few weeks our ears and eyes and our hearts have saddened with all that we have seen and heard. Men and women have been killed needlessly and under very stressful situations. Tensions that have been building for a long time have been loosed and people of all backgrounds, colors and religions are marching together. It is hard for many of us to comprehend, but I know this – we are all made in the image of God and no matter the color of our skin, the language we speak or the place we hold in society, we are all children of God. It is my hope that we can begin conversations about racism and what part it plays in our lives. It is my hope that we can begin to develop intentional relationships with others in the community and learn from one another. Paul told the Galatians – There is no longer Jew or Greek, there is no longer slave or free, there is no longer male and female; for all of you are one in Christ Jesus. (Galatians 3.28). I know that we can make a difference as we pursue this together. The Psalmist says it this way – Depart from evil, and do good; seek peace, and pursue it. Psalm 34.14
