We have never done it this way before. That is a phrase that we have both said and heard quite a bit in the past few months. That is usually a phrase that churches hear when new ideas are suggested that might involve change. Well, in 2020, everything that we have been doing is something that we've never done nor did we ever expect.

After being closed only one Sunday in March we began recording and posting worship services the following week



and then on July 19 we took on the challenge of in-person worship. We're wearing masks, are socially distanced, have hand-sanitizer available and have carefully cleaned the sanctuary, restrooms and touchable surfaces. Yet we are still recording services and posting those on YouTube, Facebook and on our website (fbcdover.org). Nearly 70 worshipers are gathering in person and many of you are among those who are participating online. I hope you will invite friends and family members to join you or to tune in online with us.

September 20 was the last Sunday that Mike and Janis Renz were with us in worship as residents of Dover. After a number of years here, Mike has retired and they have moved to Gordonville, PA that is not far from Lancaster. While a part of our church family Mike preached several times allowing me to be out of town with family and was a vital part of a Pastoral Relations Task Force. Janis used her gifts with the Shawl ministry, was on the Worship Committee and was active in many other ways. Both enjoyed working with children in VBS. We wish them many blessings and will miss them here.

### "Heed the Warning"

Nowadays, you can see a lot of warnings like "Wear a facemask", "No facemask, no entry", "No face shield, no mask, no ride", "Senior Citizens especially have very limited access to the outside world, etc.", "Be honest with your travel history and possible exposure", and many more. Even with these warnings, you can still see a lot of people who are not heeding it. This is the reason why the transmission of COVID-19 continues.

In the Bible, we can also read about stiff-necked people who did not listen to the warnings of God through the prophets.

"The LORD warned Israel and Judah through all His prophets: "Turn from your evil ways. Observe my commands and decrees, in accordance with the entire Law that I commanded your ancestors to obey and that I delivered to you through my servants the prophets". But they did not listen and were stiff-necked as their ancestors, who did not trust the LORD their God.

#### What can we learn from these verses?

A) God continues to warn people not to do evil things.

Since God has endowed us with the freedom of choice, we can either choose to obey or disobey God. God's commandments are clearly written in the Bible. It is up to us to heed it or not. Just remember that when you do not obey God's commands, there are corresponding consequences.

(B) God calls people to be His mouthpiece.

In the Bible, we can read how God has called different people to be a prophet, judge, king, priest, apostle, pastor, teacher and many more. This means that in every generation, God sends people to warn other people to choose what is right and to shun what is wrong.

If God calls us to be His mouthpiece, then accept it. It is a noble calling. It is diffcult because sometimes you will be speaking to people who refuse to listen, but it is rewarding when you see someone surrender his or her life to God.

Let us do our part in heeding the warning. Let us be responsible citizens of our country. Above all, let us be exemplary Christians who live out God's commandments and also, do our sacred duty to warn others to turn from their wicked ways.

May God bless us all as we follow and obey the word of God.




