Greetings Church Family and Friends:

I wanted to provide an update for all of us as new guidelines have been issued by the CDC and Governor Carney that relate to our gathering together for worship and other activities. Cases of COVID are decreasing dramatically across the country and here in Delaware. Mandates are lifted and capacities for gatherings have been restored and people only need to keep safely distanced. Those safe social distances have been reduced from 6 feet to 3 feet.

In the sanctuary we are going to continue to use every other pew, but other seating restrictions have been removed. After discussion among church leaders, it was agreed that we ask <u>persons attending worship</u> who have not been vaccinated to continue wearing masks. Those who are fully vaccinated can feel free to remove their mask when they are seated.

We are thankful that God has protected us during the past 14 months as together we have done our best to remain safe. Your willingness to follow COVID restrictions is appreciated and your support through this pandemic has been so helpful.

This Sunday, May 23, is Pentecost. It is a time of hearing again the scripture that tells how the Spirit of

God came over the disciples and they were able to communicate the Gospel in many languages to all those who were in Jerusalem. As Peter preached many welcomed the message and were baptized and this was the beginning of the church. We are told that they devoted themselves to the apostles teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers. How appropriate it is that restrictions are lifted this weekend and as a church we meet in celebration of



God's goodness and love for all. Join us as we worship together on Sunday and wear red as a sign of God's Spirit at Pentecost.

It was a distinct privilege for me, our family, and our church family to share in the dedication of our



granddaughter, Melody Elizabeth Hill, last Sunday. As many of you saw in person or on the video, she is very active and has her grandpa wrapped around a number of fingers. These are emotional and joyful times in ministry. I was fortunate to be able to baptize both of our children and officiated the wedding of Sarah and her husband, Dustin, in 2017. Praying for Melody and her parents was a pleasure as they promised to continue to tell her how much Jesus loves her and to be Godly examples for her and her sister, Amelia.
