Another Adventure for the Rogers'... A fantastic honor, privilege and opportunity to learn and develop as a leader; but also a hardship to endure.

In July of 2019, my unit began accepting applications for several of the top Professional Military Education (PME) schools. As a new Lieutenant Colonel, I was eligible to apply to the National War College, The Eisenhower Institute (both in Washington DC), Air War College (AL), The Army War College (Carlisle, PA) and National Security Fellowship at Harvard to name a few. Needless to say all are very prestigious year-long schools and are quite competitive to attend in *residence*. It is also important to note that while they each have a different approach, they all meet the important academic requirement for senior military officers to expand their scope of influence. These courses provide advanced instruction on leadership and military strategy across a range of interests, preparing and qualifying officers for higher levels of leadership. With a lot of prayer and discussions with my family I went on to apply to them all. The application process was very rigorous, assembling all of my accolades, procuring letters of recommendation from Colonels and General Officers took a great deal of time and effort, but the idea of continued learning and mastering my craft has always been a very important part of my work ethic and motivation to persist in this endeavor of service.

In December of 2019 I learned that I was NOT selected for either school. Friends and mentors of mine explained that I was a very good candidate but they weren't surprised by the Air Force's decision because of how recent it was that I was promoted. I was technically still a Major when I started my application and quite young as a 37 year old Lieutenant Colonel. I was very disappointed as my ambitious plans were thoroughly disrupted, but I remembered in that moment; my wife's favorite Bible verse from the book Jeremiah [29:11-12] "For I know the plans I have for you...plans to prosper you and not harm you, plans to give you hope and a future...". This verse came clearly into focus not long after the disappointing news, when I learned that I had been by-name recommended for 2020 Fellowship of Leadership Delaware Inc. (LDI), a local non-profit organization that sets out to affect positive change in the Delaware Community by attracting young leaders; developing, informing and connecting them; and then also challenging them with being the engines of positive change and support for our state. This opportunity would not have been possible if I had gone off for the PME. Applying and competing for a fellowship with LDI was certainly among the most difficult processes I'd ever experienced; but I was accepted and was then able to deeply invest my focus and attention into this fantastic organization. I learned so much about leadership, cooperation, and how our state functions. That year long experience with LDI had prepared me for more than I could have expected. I was especially blessed that it allowed me to remain here at home during the year of COVID19, when my family, my community and my unit/organization needed me the most. God's plan proved to be way better than mine; as it says in Proverbs 16:9 "In their hearts humans plan their course, but the Lord establishes their steps". As my year with LDI came to a close I decided to submit an application again to my military leadership to attend a PME a course. Surprisingly, on the same December day we graduated from LDI, I was presented an acceptance letter to the US Army War College Class of 2022! I was in a state of shock, as mentioned it is very competitive and prestigious to attend a service's senior school in residence; what makes it even more amazing is that rather than going to the Air Force's War College, I'll be representing the Air Force and Air National Guard at the school of a sister service.

I will begin this year-long endeavor in August 2021, and it will require me to live in Carlisle, PA – about 3 hours from Dover DE. My wife Michelle, who is the Commander of the 512th Force Support Squadron at Dover Air Force Base, will not be able to make the trip with me as her duty to her unit and our family require her to remain full-time serving the men and women of 512th Airlift Wing. We have endured family hardships before during times when one of us were called to serve or train elsewhere. Though this time will surely be different as our girls Ava and Zoe will be starting kindergarten in the fall and I will unfortunately yet certainly miss some of that action. There is never a good time to be separated but I'm thankful for being accepted when I did, I feel so much

more prepared for the endeavor and so is our family. I am also thankful that unlike many other hardships of separation we've endured, we'll be able to spend most weekends and holidays together. Finally, we always appreciate the prayers and support from our family, friends and Church congregation, that have always been there time and again supporting us as we navigate the paths our military service has put us on. We are forever grateful.

A bit more about the school:

The US Army War College educates and develops leaders for service at the strategic level while advancing knowledge in the global application of Landpower.



The purpose of US Army War College at this time in our Nation's history is to produce graduates from all our courses who are skilled critical thinkers and complex problem solvers in the global application of Landpower. Concurrently, it is our duty to the Army to also act as a "Think Factory" for Commanders and Civilian Leaders at the strategic level worldwide and routinely engage in discourse and debate on ground forces' role in achieving national security objectives. This is graduate level (Master's Degree) program that will expose students to a learning environment consisting of members of sister services and coalition partners.
