Ministries. We find out about the hands-on ministry of our missionaries and how lives are transformed around the world and are Surprised by God's Glory. We learn, promote, and give to the World Mission Offering during October.

WMO 2021: What is the World Mission Offering? (October 2021)

Through International Ministries' World Mission Offering, thousands across the country celebrate and support ministries that God is using to transform the world.

For more than two hundred years, International Ministries (also known as the American Baptist Foreign Mission Society), has combined resilience, adaptability, and creative approaches to crosscultural ministry with faithfulness to Scripture. We serve together with and learn from our many local partners in ministry around the globe.

During the 2021 World Mission Offering, you can see highlights of the work of Global Servants <u>Ketly and Vital Pierre</u> in the Dominican Republic, as they provide education, Bible studies, language classes, a micro-loan program, legal counseling, and more for Haitian immigrants facing inequity and maltreatment in the Dominican Republic. You can hear from Global Servants <u>Alise</u> and <u>Mark Juanes</u>, as they talk about their ministry of practical care and love for the hill tribe children in Chiang Mai, Thailand. You can also see the impact of Global Servant <u>Ricardo Mayol-Bracero</u>'s ministry, as he serves and stands alongside communities in Latin America trying to access clean water and air.

Through these three ministries you will have a glimpse into what God is doing through International Ministries' 120+ global servants, 900+ volunteers, home staff, and 250+ international partners in 70 countries.

This October, our church has the opportunity to join the transformational work God is doing as we work cross-culturally to invite people to become disciples of Jesus Christ and to proclaim, through both word and deed, God's reign of justice, peace, and abundant life for all creation. God can use your participation not only to change lives internationally, but also to deepen your own discipleship in Christ. You can take part in what the Holy Spirit is doing to bring God's kingdom "on earth as it is in heaven."
