This year seems to be moving quickly past us as we turn the calendar to November. We feel that 2021 is coming close to an end with temperatures dropping along with the leaves. This month is always special for us individually as well for our congregation. We have times of giving and sharing with others and gathering to give thanks for God's generosity.

Two things are happening on the first weekend of November that have been traditional activities for our church family. For many, many years our congregation has

had an active Food Pantry and we have worked directly with the state Social Services agency for referrals of individuals and families who have food insecurities. We also have referrals from other churches in the community, other agencies and schools. In recent years the churches in the community, as part of the Kent

Ecumenical Food and Crisis Fund, have sponsored a **Food Drive** at local grocery stores. On Friday and Saturday, November 5 & 6, that Food Drive will be at all three Redner's stores and half of the food collected at all three sites will come to the First Baptist Church Food Pantry. **VOLUNTEERS ARE NEEDED** to help in the pantry both days from 10 AM - 6 PM in 2-hour shifts. Volunteers are also needed to staff the table at the Greentree Redner's on Friday from 10 AM - 6 PM in 2-hour shifts. Those at Redner's will need to greet shoppers, hand a shopping guide of needed items, and collect the food items as they leave the store. Please call the church -302-674-1980 – to volunteer.

<u>The second thing</u> that will happen on Saturday evening is our <u>Stewardship Dinner</u>. The theme this year - **Time, Talent, & Treasure** – will be a way that we can explore God's generosity and how we have the privilege of



using all that we have been given. So many times, in a stewardship emphasis, the financial need of the church is the only concern. But this theme is different as we celebrate how we give thanks to God by being good stewards of our financial resources, our skills and talents and the way we use our time. Come and share the fellowship around the tables, the testimonies, and the delicious home-cooked, catered dinner. Join in on Saturday, November 6 at 5:00 PM in the Fellowship Hall and the cost is \$15 per person and \$25 per family in the

same household. Call the church to make your reservation.

On Sunday, November 21, we will have a special time during worship to prayerfully offer our commitments to God for the coming year. Together we will commit to pray for the ministry and mission of the church, and we will commit our financial giving for those ministries in 2022. Join us for this special dedication Sunday.

During this month we will have the privilege of dedicating the many shoeboxes that you and others have filled for children around the world through Operation Christmas Child. Join us on Sunday, November 14, during worship for the dedication.

Thanksgiving is a special time during November for our country, our families and each of us as we pause to give thanks. This may be a time for traveling or receiving family or making those special phone calls to tell others how thankful you are for them. Paul told us ... "Give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you." 1 Thessalonians 4.18. I hope that you will take the time each day to give thanks, not only on one designated day, but each day. Give thanks to God in all circumstances.

The last Sunday of November is the First Sunday of Advent. Advent is that time of waiting and preparing to welcome Jesus, the Son of God, into our lives. Each Sunday we begin to prepare for Christmas as we celebrate Jesus. Plan to worship and grow together during this unique time filled with traditions and newness at the same time. Invite others to worship with you as together we enjoy the music of the season and once again remember the distinct stories.

During this month of November, let us show our thanks to Him to prepare ourselves for His most precious gift, Jesus.
