We have received word that Julie Kerr, the wife of Rev. Larin Kerr, died in early September, 2021. She had been living with her son and daughter-in-law, David and Sharon, in Port Orchard, WA. Sharon writes that "Julie had just

moved into a memory care facility and fell hitting her head and had several brain bleeds. She died a few days later." Larin served First Baptist as our Minister of Christian Education from 1971-73 along with Julie and their five children. After leaving FBC, they served, through the American Baptist Home Mission Society, Native American churches in Montana and Oklahoma, and previously in Arizona. Larin died in 2017 and his family was given permission by the Rainy Mountain Kiowa Indian Baptist Church in OK to inter his ashes in their cemetery--an indication of how well loved and respected he was by that congregation.
