Those gathered will then process to the Green, Wesley UMC, The Presbyterian Church, People's Church, DSU Downtown Chapel on Division where the college choir will sing outside with chairs provided and conclude at Mt. Zion AME. Following a cross through the streets of Dover, prayers will be offered at each stop.

Resurrection Sunday – Easter, April 17, will begin with a Sunrise Service at 8 AM in the Fellowship Hall followed by a light breakfast. Our Easter Celebration service will be at 11 AM as we realize how we have received God's mercy through the Open Tomb. Please plan to join us for any or all the services during this meaningful journey as we are reminded of this ...
