

child, a November seemed to Give Thanks be an exceptionally long month because it was such a long time until December and Santa would

come. As an adult and a teacher. November flew by too quickly. At school, we had the most holidays that earned a day off and fewer teaching days than a regular month would have. We had a day off for elections, then came Veterans Day, followed by two days of conferences, and, finally, three days for Thanksgiving.

There was so much to do to prepare for conferences, namely figuring out grades and what to say to parents who always thought their child was perfect. Each child was perfect in their own way but not necessarily in their parent's way. Trying to keep the conferences positive was sometimes difficult. First grade was usually where teachers would first suggest that their child might not be as mature or able to focus on learning as other children the same age. More emphasis on behavior was also stressed. I was so thankful for our loving God

because He always helped me through those tough conferences.

Being able to communicate through prayer always gave me peace of mind as I went into these difficult discussions. God was guiding me through them, helping me make suggestions to help the parents help their child. When we pray, we should praise Him for all He has done for us, followed by our prayer requests, and ending with thanking Him. I used that as a guide to talk with parents. First, I would praise the child for what they could do well, then discuss what problems they were having, and then give suggestions for how to solve those problems. God's example helped me tremendously at this time of year so that I would not alienate parents. Knowing He was there with me, gave me solace.

Thanksgiving followed conferences soon after. Knowing how God had so recently assisted me, I could fully enjoy traveling to Pennsylvania to be with all our family for that special holiday. We knew He was watching over our travels and preparations for the big dinner we would all enjoy together. Sharing our love with one another was felt deep in our hearts. This time together enabled us to remember the biggest and most precious gift God gave us, His son, Jesus. My prayer for you for November is that you and your family can pray together and thank God for the bountiful blessings He has given you. I pray that His gift of His son will give you the peace and contentment you need during this busy and stressful time of year.
