"Why do bad things happen to good people?"

March is a month of many changes. It begins with bitter temperatures and unpredictable weather conditions. But by the end of the month, signs of Spring can be seen. In school, we'd make paper plate puppets. One side was a lion and the other side was a lamb. Each morning we'd check the weather to see if it was a lion or lamb day and graph it. At the end of March, we'd see what our graph told us. The children could see patterns in the graph. They'd see how March was a month of transitions.

We, as a church, are beginning to go through a big transition. As the Search Committee begins its task of finding first a transition pastor and then a permanent pastor, many of your prayers will be needed, as well as, love, patience, and cooperation. We know God has someone in mind for us at FBC. We just have to go through the process set down by ABCOPAD to find that special someone. We will be collecting data and meeting pastors who will give trial sermons. We may ask for surveys to be completed. Please do your part by completing them and returning them to the committee. This whole process may take as long as eighteen months to complete or longer. At our business meetings, the committee will report on its progress.

Currently, the Search Committee is working

on a church profile. Prospective pastoral candidates want to know about the church family. That's why you were asked to fill out the demographic's survey. After that is completed, ABCOPAD will then check who's available as an interim pastor and try to direct them to FBC. Writing this document will take some time. We've already met four times. This committee is actively searching. Please continue to pray for them as they go through this process.

As deacons, we are asked to fill in when a pastor's service is needed. If you need help, you can call your deacon. We will try to do our best to guide you to whatever needs you may have. There are some local ministers who will be available depending on what your needs are. We, of course, cannot do marriages, funerals, or baptisms. We are able to refer you to someone who can provide those services. We can pray and comfort you, visit you, take you to appointments or for groceries or give you communion. We can also preach a sermon if necessary. By this time, you should have gotten a letter from your deacon with phone numbers to contact them. If they don't answer, please leave a brief message and they will return your call ASAP.

Let's pray together:

2023 REGIONAL PROJECT

Sue Hegarty is a Global Servant with International Ministries (IM) serving in Costa Rica. Her ministry is to come along side Nicaraguan immigrant women & children leaving situations of domestic violence.

Factors against them:

- •Low education level (often less than 3rd grade) so job options are limited
- High level of prejudice against them in the general Costa Rican population
- Fathers of the children are not assisting in any way (financial or otherwise)
- •No extended family support nearby or dysfunctional family relationships
- •Often have 3+ children to provide for
- •Come out of situations of domestic violence, often told by society and the church disregard abuse, and make the relationship work. They are coping with layers of trauma

Factors in their favor:

- Committed to providing for their children, not afraid of hard work and sacrifices
- Eager to learn new skills to work or get a better job
- Desperately for a better life and schooling for their children

What American Baptist Women's Ministries of Pennsylvania & Delaware can help provide:

- Emergency assistance (medical care, food, housing, etc.)
- Legalization of immigration status (obtaining documentation, paperwork, fees, transportation, or a lawyer)
- Formal education assistance (Tutoring of children and adults, supplying basic school supplies)
- Job skill training assistance (Registration and tuition assistance, supplies)
- •Counseling for trauma (Some is free through the justice system; others need to draw on private counseling.)
- Group care/Pastoral care (Celebrations of special events and Bible studies with supplies and transportation)
- Publication of Bible studies (studies written for women and girls at risk, based on biblical women)


Lenten 2023


