

DIMH Update: March 16, 2023

The shelter and resource center are both relocating this weekend, as the property at 684 Forest Street was leased from the Downtown Dover Partnership, which plans to utilize it.

The shelter will be at Walt Bagley Hall, 1155 Walker Road. The building can accommodate 40 men. Some will live upstairs in transitional housing, while the shelter will be downstairs. DIMH director Karen Rowland and food/donations coordinator Wilma Hall will work in this building.

Dinner will made available to all 40 residents following the pattern we have had for years. The building has a commercial kitchen and a smaller dining room.

DIMH has purchased two buildings with American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds, which will also cover renovations:

1156 Walker Road (former St. John's Lutheran School) will be converted to a shelter for women and children. Plans for water, sewer, and drainage upgrades have been provided to the City of Dover for review, which does not require City Council approval. The architectural plans have preliminary approval by the city building inspector. It is expected that 40 individuals will reside in four dormitories with ample program and recreation space. Karen Rowland and Wilma Hall will relocate to this facility when open. The hope is to open it by the end of 2023.

630 W. Division Street is a 19,700-square-foot building for multiple purposes. It will house the DIMH Resource Center beginning March 27, with case management and related services provided in this location. Some offices and a church will continue to lease space in the building. The rear half will be converted to apartments: five-man units will be located upstairs, with each man having his own small bedroom while sharing kitchen, bath, and living areas. Downstairs will have two- and three-bedroom apartments for families. There will be laundry facilities on both floors. A small clinic will also be in the building to provide medical care focused on those experiencing homelessness.

Housing at 630 W. Division will focus on those moving from shelter to stability, with all residents required to participate in case management and programs of self-development.

DIMH continues to operate Interfaith Crossing as long-term housing for men who have moved on from homelessness. Two houses within Dover offer shared housing for the same target population.

Residence in DIMH shelters is provided at no charge. Housing operates with rents sufficient to cover costs and will be determined.

The Dover Interfaith Mission for Housing will continue to welcome the provision of meals and food donations at Walt Bagley Hall.

Volunteers are sought for assistance with the resource center. Training is provided and hours are weekdays from 8:30 to 4:30, with volunteers able to work on shifts of their choice.
