## A Mother's Devotional

In school, we had a large bulletin board outside of our rooms which needed decorating every month. In April, we made large raindrops for April Showers. On the raindrops, each child would write a story about the raindrop. Then in May, we'd replace the raindrops with large paper flowers. At the bottom were the words "Bring May flowers." For first graders, mothers are very special people. We'd use the flower theme then to make giant cards for mom. Sometimes the cards would be accompanied by decorated paper cups containing real flowers we raised in class, flowers that were bought, or tissue ones we made. The children would beam with pride when they took them home.

We were fortunate enough to have a very dedicated teacher named Anna McKinney who taught Special Needs Students. She was also a member of FBC and participated in our Sanctuary Choir. She would often cut out articles from newspapers, magazines or catalogs and put them in our choir folders for us to find. One article she shared was the one about Mother's Day. It started in 1912 in West Virginia. The article said they wanted to recognize mothers as an important part of our culture. Mothers love their children like no one else. Who do they go to when they're not feeling well? Who do they want to be proud of them? Who gets fistfuls of wildflowers frequently? Mothers love their children even if they've been naughty, no matter how old those children are!

God created mothers to have a special place in our families. Even though fathers help around the house, mothers are the predominant caregivers. Lots of mothers work outside of the home these days which adds another major task for them to juggle in their busy day. They worry constantly about babysitters, cleaning, washing, cooking, helping with homework, meeting deadlines at work, taking their children to special activities, and handling illnesses. To do everything in their day, they usually wake up first and are the last ones to go to bed at night.

Mothers, if we raise our children to love our Lord and Savior, their lives will be filled with joy and love. Every day is a teaching day. They need to know the Ten Commandments from Ephesians 6:1-3. We can introduce them to mothers in the Bible like Mary, the Mother of Jesus from John 19. There, also, is Elizabeth from Luke 1. Hannah promised her son to God in 1 Samuel 1. The list goes on. Many women from the Bible dedicated their lives to God and taught their children to honor Him as well.

Children and husbands, think about everything your mother and wife do each day to make your life easier. Show her your love and appreciation this Mother's Day with a special card or little homemade gift that will mean the world to her. Here are some beautiful passages you could use for your card:

## 2022-2023 REGIONAL PROJECT

Sue Haggerty is a Global Servant with International Ministries (IM) serving in Costa Rica. Her ministry is to come along side Nicaraguan Immigrant women & children leaving situations of domestic violence.

### Factors against them:

\*Low education level (often less than 3<sup>rd</sup> grade) so job options are limited \*High level of prejudice against them in the general Costa Rican population

\*Fathers of the children are not assisting in any way (financial or otherwise)

\*No extended family support nearby or dysfunctional family relationships \*Often have 3+ children to provide for

\*Come out of situations of domestic violence, often told by society and the church to disregard abuse, and make the relationship work. They are

\*Committed to providing for their children, not afraid of hard work and sacrifices

\*Eager to learn new skills to work or get a better job

\*Desperate for a better life and schooling for their children

What American Baptist Women's Ministries of Pennsylvania & Delaware can help provide:



\*Emergency assistance (medical care, food housing etc.)

\*Legalization of immigration status (obtaining documentation, paperwork, fees, transportation, or a lawyer)

\*Formal education assistance (Tutoring of children and adults, supplying basic school supplies)

\*Job skill training assistance (Registration and tuition assistance, supplies)

\*Counseling for trauma (Some is free through the justice system; others need to draw on private counseling.) \*Group care/Pastoral care (Celebrations of special events and Bible studies with supplies and transportation) \*Publication of Bible studies (studies written for women and girls at risk, based on biblical women)
