
When Jesus left this life, He said He needed to leave so the Comforter could come. He was both divine and human and taught, befriended and healed many of that time.

Bio of Rev. William A. Guy

Rev. William A. Guy was born and raised in Chester, Pennsylvania, and found his way to Dover, Delaware via Delaware State University where he obtained a Bachelor's Degree in Business Administration. In 2015, he obtained his Master's Degree in Divinity from Liberty Theological Seminary out of Lynchburg, Virginia. In 2021, he completed one unit of Clinical Pastoral Education with R.C. Freedom Ministries, Inc.

He has served in ministry for over 23 years, impacting many areas within the church and the community: President of Delaware State University Baptist Student Union, Statutory Ministry Volunteer at Wesley College, Director and Co-Advisor of Young Adult Ministry, Spiritual Advisor for Youth Ministries, Director of Tutoring Services, Director of the Boys to Men Mentoring Program, Director of the Drama Ministry, New Members and Discipleship Class Teacher, Sunday School Teacher, Director of Outreach, Back2School Community Fair Co-Chair, and Adjunct Instructor at the Charles Hammond Bible Institute and Calvary Bible College and Seminary.

Over the last ten years, he has served on the staff of Calvary Baptist Church of Dover, Delaware. His positions included Director of the Downtown Queen Street Service, where he ensured a contemporary style service was being offered to the local and surrounding community. He also served as an Associate Pastor, overseeing the children, youth, and young adult ministry. His most recent role was Assistant Pastor, where he oversaw the ministries of the church to provide advisement, planning, coordination, and collaboration.

Rev. Guy has been working at Bank of America for the last 21 years. His current role includes being a consultant, content designer and facilitator of associate and leader training. He also serves as a Chaplain with the Delaware Air National Guard where he supports 1100 airmen.

He is a proud member of The American Association of Christian Counselors and Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc., Zeta Rho Lambda Chapter.

So let's not allow ourselves to get fatigued doing good. At the right time we will harvest a good crop if we don't give up... — Galatians 6:9 —



Our ABWM ladies are wrapping up another busy year of ministries with an end of the year luncheon on May 20th at Piazza Mia. The Ann Clemmer, Mary Bonar, and Joyce Reed Circles are preparing to send a total of \$1786 to our regional project in Costa Rica. We deeply appreciate all those who bought our Easter Eggs year and/or contributed monies for Sue Hegarty to

continue her work training abused women and helping them start a new life in a new country. In addition, each circle will be sending monies to support their circles' namesakes for their individual mission assignments. Through their monthly offerings, the circles will also be giving monies to the Overseas Purchase Plan. Part of this money will give India help to build hospitals and clinics, and purchase mobile unit supplies. Some will also go to Nicaragua for medical supplies and training health promotors. Some will go to South Africa for health kits for Health Builders.

We'll be taking the summer off, but return in September to begin another year helping wherever it is needed. If you enjoy mission work, fellowship with other women, and learning about other women of other countries, you might enjoy visiting one or all the circles to see what ABWM is all about. We'd love to have you join us.


