A Food Pantry – Missions Project.

Earlier this year, the Missions Board was requested to help the needy with more than just the Food Pantry. It was noticed that Christ Episcopal Church has a Blessings Box in their downtown location. See the picture:



Ours will be similar to this picture and will hold food with pop-top cans or dry food, like cereal, and plastic utensils. It can also hold other items for people like toothpaste, tooth brushes, and other toiletries. This box should only hold items that will not freeze, as it gets colder. It will be located in the church's front yard on the right side as you enter the property. It will be close to Walker Road, but far enough away to follow the city regulations. We will be seeking food donations once it is constructed and in place before the end of August.
