## The Deacon's Fund

In Matthew 25 Jesus states: <sup>34</sup> "Then the King will say to those on his right, 'Come, you who are blessed by my Father; take your inheritance, the kingdom prepared for you since the creation of the world. <sup>35</sup> For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in, <sup>36</sup> I needed clothes and you clothed me, I was sick and you looked after me, I was in prison and you came to visit me.'

<sup>37</sup> "Then the righteous will answer him, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you something to drink? <sup>38</sup> When did we see you a stranger and invite you in, or needing clothes and clothe you? <sup>39</sup> When did we see you sick or in prison and go to visit you?'

<sup>40</sup> "The King will reply, 'Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me.'

When we help each other we have helped Him. As he states in Matthew, we are to help each other. One of the ways we can help is through the Deacon's Fund. Sometimes, we can get into a situation that seems impossible to get out of. There are any number of reasons this can happen. Loss of a job, or reduced income, bills mounting up or just bad budgeting on our part, whatever the reason might be, you need help and you need it now. You can't get a loan and in the long run, it wouldn't help. You are between a rock and a hard place.

The Deacon's Fund has helped countless members and regular attenders at FBC. The people receiving the help are just as anonymous as the givers. That way the dignity of the person being helped can be saved and the help provided can start them on the right path again. In today's world, any one of us could be there or have been there.

But, how can we help? Every Sunday morning, there is a small brown envelope labeled **DEACON'S FUND**. You can put money or a check into that envelope and put it into the offering plate. Every Communion Sunday, a note in the bulletin reminds you to give to the Deacon's Fund.
