"The Doctrine

of the Trinity" Percy Navarro

I. Can you find the word "Trinity" in the Bible?


- If it's not in the Bible, do you believe in Trinity? •
- Some professing Christians don't believe in "Trinity" because it's not in the Bible. II. Origin of the "Doctrine of Trinity":
- About 300 years after Jesus' death, the nature of Jesus Christ and His relationship to the Father became an issue. Was Jesus 'begotten' by the Father from his own being (John 3:16), and therefore having no beginning, or else created out of nothing, and therefore having a beginning.
- Two opposing views:
- Arius, a priest from Alexandria, Egypt, taught that Christ, because He was the Son of God, must have had a beginning and therefore was a special creation of God. Further, if Jesus was the Son, the Father of necessity must be older. Son has a beginning
- St. Alexander and Athanasius from Alexandria believed that the Father and the Son were one but at the same time distinct from each other... Son has no beginning.
- 325 AD/CE, First Council of Nicaea, convened by Roman Emperor, Constantine, the council decided against the Arians overwhelmingly (of the estimated 250-318 attendees, all but two agreed).
- 342-343 AD, The ongoing disagreements were at times violent and bloody. Of the aftermath of the Council of Nicaea, noted historian Will Durant writes, "Probably more Christians were slaughtered by Christians in these two years (342-3) than by all the persecutions of Christians by pagans in the history of Rome" (The Story of Civilization, Vol. 4: The Age of Faith, 1950, p. 8). Atrociously, while claiming to be Christian many believers fought and slaughtered one another over their differing views of God!
- Question about the nature of the Holy Spirit:
- Council of Nicaea said simply, "We believe in the Holy Spirit." "People were confused about the Holy Spirit. Was it simply a synonym for God or was it something more?"


381 AD/CE: 44 years after Constantine's death, Emperor Theodosius the Great convened the Council of Constantinople (today Istanbul, Turkey) to resolve these disputes. The teaching of the three Cappadocian theologians "made it possible for the Council of Constantinople (381) to affirm the divinity of the Holy Spirit, which up to that point *had nowhere been clearly stated, not even in Scripture*".

- The council adopted a statement that translates into English as, in part: "We believe in one God, the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth, and of all things visible and invisible; and in one Lord Jesus Christ, the only-begotten Son of God, begotten of the Father before all ages . . . And we believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord and Giver of life, who proceeds from the Father, who with the Father and the Son together is worshipped and glorified, who spoke by the prophets . . ." The statement also affirmed belief "in one holy, catholic [meaning in this context universal, whole or complete] and apostolic Church . . ." With this declaration in 381, which would become known as the Nicene-Constantinopolitan Creed, the Trinity as generally understood today became the official belief and teaching concerning the nature of God.
- The Christian doctrine of Trinity (Latin: Trinitas, lit. 'triad', from trinus, "threefold") holds that God is three consubstantial (of the same substance or essence) persons – the Father, the Son (Jesus Christ), and the Holy Spirit – as "one God in three Divine Persons".
 - This is the God who created the universe, the god who formed us. These three Divine Persons are mentioned in both Old Testament and New Testament.



On Easter Sunday in 1949, on nation-wide radio, Christians were challenged to donate one million dollars in

one hour to help people devastated by the aftermath of World War II. The 33rd U.S. President, Harry S. Truman, addressed the country. This included "There are thousands of children in foreign lands today who have no memory of their parents, no knowledge of the meaning of the words "home" and "family" and who have forgotten what it feels like to have enough to eat. There are hopeless thousands who wander among shattered towns seeking a place to rest, seeking security and a chance to begin their lives anew. There are many who pray to God only in secret, fearing persecution if they profess their beliefs openly."

The broadcast concluded by asking Americans to give generously the next morning in their churches as more than 75,000 churches responded.

In 1973, American Baptists formally joined the movement that had been carried forward by several Protestant denominations. Giving to OGHS was \$82,045 in 1973. Over the decades since, American Baptists have increased their support for the offering and in doing so have been sharing the light in all corners of the world.

In Eugene Peterson's paraphrase of Matthew 5:13-16, we understand the clear commission to show up brightly in the world and be generous with our lives. That is the invitation extended in their year's theme, "Share the Light". The scriptures tell us that huge crowds were gathering, drawn to Jesus by his teachings and the miracles of healing he performed. So Jesus climbed a hill and delivered his "sermon on the mount" to an audience captivated by his message and ways. He offered them blessings, affirming them in ways probably no one had before.

Then he described a life of discipleship characterized by prayer, humility, love of one's enemies and a steady practice of being "salt and light", sharing the goodness of God.

One Great Hour of Sharing is a beautiful opportunity to do just that. When we participate in this sharing, we become a prism of light scattering blessing in places that desperately need it.
