This year's project was to support Honduras to provide clean drinking water. How often do we take for granted something as simple as clean water. From a glass of iced water or the water we use to brush our teeth! To be honest, do we really think about it? We are so blessed to live in this country where we have abundant access to pure and clean water. This is not the case in some places such as Honduras.

So, during VBS, the children and adults lovingly brought their offerings each night and the total came to \$336.06! It only takes \$5 to provide clean water for one child to drink

per year. That's enough to provide 67 people with clean water for a year!

Using the envelope provided, please enclose or mail a \$10 donation for each box to help with shipping and processing. We felt the first three priorities were so close together that those were areas we would want a part-time minister to initiate. The last two priorities would be handled by lay people. A full-time minister would do all with help from lay leaders.

Many people questioned about why we shouldn't just hire Rev. Guy. The main reason is that Rev. Guy asked to have his name be removed from the list of candidates. With his continuing duties with the Reserves, he cannot dedicate his time to a full-time position as our minister. Therefore, we are still reviewing other applications that have been sent to us. We have spoken to several of them thus far. We need to get to know them better before making any rushed decisions. We are a unique congregation which shares a delightful diversity of people. We need to find that special person God has in mind for us and remember that He will decide whom it will be when He is ready. Therefore, we are continuing to review applications for a full-time pastor. We continue to covet your prayers and patience. Thank you for your understanding.
