Resiliency



The need to enhance individual resiliency has been brought to the forefront across our modern society. Whether it's school students, factory workers, military personnel, and on, finding ways to help individuals cope with life's stressors has been a priority for

many institutions. Resiliency is the ability to recover from difficulties and adapt to changing or challenging circumstances. A person's overall well-being is directly connected to their mental, emotional, and spiritual resiliency; and it is a theme deeply woven into the fabric of biblical narratives. The Bible is filled with stories of individuals and communities who faced adversity yet emerged stronger, providing timeless lessons on the power of faith and perseverance.

One of the most poignant examples of resiliency is found in the story of Job. Despite experiencing profound loss—his wealth, health, and family—Job maintained his faith in God. His journey illustrates that resilience is not merely about enduring hardship, but also about maintaining hope. Job's declaration, "*Though he slay me, yet will I hope in him*" (Job 13:15), serves as a powerful reminder that faith can be a source of strength in the darkest of times. It highlights the belief that, even in suffering, there is a purpose and a promise of restoration.


Similarly, the Israelites' exodus from Egypt exemplifies communal resilience. After generations of slavery, they faced the daunting task of crossing the Red Sea, pursued by Pharaoh's army. Their story, culminating in miraculous deliverance, underscores the importance of collective faith and action. As they stood at the shoreline, their fear was palpable, yet they were

reminded to "be still" and see the salvation of the Lord (Exodus 14:13). This narrative emphasizes that resilience often requires unity and trust in a higher power, reinforcing the belief that faith can lead to liberation.

Moreover, the New Testament offers insights into personal resiliency through the life of the Apostle Paul. Imprisoned and persecuted, Paul wrote letters that inspired countless believers, urging them to rejoice in suffering and to find strength in weakness. His words, "I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me" (Philippians 4:13), encapsulate the essence of resilience rooted in faith.

In conclusion, the Bible teaches that resiliency is intertwined with faith, hope, and community. Through the trials of Job, the Israelites, and Paul, we learn that true resilience is not the absence of struggle but the triumph over it, grounded in an unwavering belief in God's promises.

RAY is the International Ministries global consultant for Immigrants and Refugees. He networks with IM colleagues and international partners that serve with refugees and displaced peoples, helping to strengthen their ministries, find needed resources and build capacity. Ray works to construct bridges between U.S. and P.R. churches and these partners, providing opportunities to serve some of the most vulnerable people in the world. In addition, Ray hosts several teams per year in international cross-cultural settings where they can learn about the struggles of migrants, the realities of global immigration and border policies.



Children's Baptism Classes



We at First Baptist will be privileged to have as our morning speaker on October 13 IM Global Consultant for Immigrants and Refugees Ray Schellinger. Ray has recently been in Israel/Palestine where he conferred with Palestinian Christians about ways of partnering with them to respond to the needs of the people of Gaza and the West Bank once the war is over. A very timely topic! During the Sunday School hour (9:30-10:30) Ray will have an informal discussion question/answer time with both adult SS classes and other interested adults in Fellowship Hall. All adults are invited to join us! During worship Ray will deliver the morning sermon. Don't miss this opportunity to hear first-hand from one of IM's global servants! (Ray is no stranger to FBC. His mother Gaynor Sale is a former member of FB. Plus, in 2007 a group of 7 from First Baptist spent a week working at Deborah's House, Tijuana, Mexico when Ray and his wife Adalia were serving as IM missionaries there.)
