# **Pray and Vote**

When we think of November, what comes to mind -Day Lights Savings Time, Veteran's Day, Thanksgiving, Black Friday? But how many of us think of Election Day. We, as Christians, have a responsibility to pray and vote in all elections. A study from Arizona Christian University's Cultural Research Center revealed that around 32 million selfidentified Christians who attend church may abstain from voting in the 2024 U.S. presidential election. The research asked people who indicated they were not likely to vote to explain the reasons for that choice. The most common reason, offered by twothirds of the nonvoters (68%) was a lack of interest in politics and elections. More than half of those surveyed (57%) expressed dissatisfaction with both primary contenders. Additionally, 55% stated that neither candidate adequately represented their personal values. And sadly, 48% also expressed the fear that the election results will be manipulated.

Of course, one of the biggest problems with this passivity is that November 5 involves more than the White House. Many would contend that there are much more important decisions than the presidency on the state and local ballot. Control of the House and Senate hangs in the balance. Governors, state legislators, state attorneys general, local offices, etc. are also being decided. Christians could be the deciding factor in a lot of federal and state races – and are choosing not to be.

A study of the 55 founders who met in Philadelphia to come up with the Constitution showed that 52 of them were men in good standing with Trinitarian churches. These were not secular men, but Christians. John Adams is quoted as saying, "Our Constitution was made only for a moral and religious people. It is wholly inadequate to the government of any other."

Throughout scripture, it has always been about picking the lesser of two evils. To vote is a biblically based opportunity provided to us by God. It you read the Parable of the Talents (Matthew 25:14-30), you see what happens when we don't utilize the opportunities (talents) that we have been given by God. If we choose to bury them, like the unproductive servant, there will be severe consequences for not using the gifts God has provided. So, when you don't vote, you are burying your opportunity.

As a Christian, we need to stand for Biblical principal when we vote. And above all, we need to pray that God will heal our land and turn hearts across our nation back to Him. The famous theologian Billy Graham stated, "The Bible tells us to pray for 'all those in authority, that we may live peaceful and quiet lives in all godliness and holiness' (1 Timothy 2:2). When we pray regularly for those who are willing to serve as political leaders, it will help us make the best choices when we go to the polls, for God gives us wisdom when we humble ourselves and pray for His guidance."

"We have a serious responsibility to pray for America, for the election and for wisdom on how we should vote." (Franklin Graham). When we are not involved in the political process, it leaves the door wide-open for every evil ideology to fill the vacuum. There are 90 million self-identified Christians eligible to vote in the United States of America. Will you be one of the 32 million who are going to sit on the sidelines? Or you be one of the ones who exercises the God given opportunity to vote?

I will end this with some final thoughts –

"If your candidate loses, our Sovereign Lord is in no less control. If your candidate wins, our split nation needs no less prayers."

## FBC Dover Family and Friends, Are You Ready for Stewardship Month?

In Luke 12:42-48, Jesus talks with His disciples about the Parable of the Faithful Steward. This entire section of Luke 12 is focused on being ready to act according to God's will. The latter part of verse 48 of this chapter is where we read the famous text, "When someone has been given much, much will be required in return; and when someone has been entrusted with much, even more will be required."

God expects us to use what He has given us to serve Him and others. In this parable, the master put the servant in charge of his household, expecting the servant to "act" at the proper time. So, two things are important, what action to take and when.
