#### "Christmas Traditions"

This year the Deacons decided to celebrate our annual Christmas Tea with the theme Family Traditions. Did you ever wonder where some of your family traditions came from? Traditions are an integral part of any holiday event for every family. They are passed down from generation to generation and often evolve as time passes and people change. We could write books upon books about different holidays and traditions for each. Therefore, this article will base itself on some of First Baptist's traditions.

Planning for the Christmas season begins early with the Pastor, Deacons, Missions, Trustees and Christian Education Boards preparing for the first Sunday in Advent. Each board and their committees have specific items for which they are responsible.

First, the pastor at the various board meetings tells them what he has in mind for this year. Then the boards talk about how they can accomplish their tasks in the overall presentation of Christmas. Of course, the pastor has his sermons to prepare. Sometimes he also prepares the Christmas Eve Service and/or the Advent wreath. Different pastors through the years have a special written Advent lighting ceremony. Each Sunday in Advent a different group of people or families light the candles and read scriptures for the four different candles of Love, Hope, Joy and Peace. On Christmas Eve, we have readings from scripture of the Bible's version of the birth of Christ, carols and a candle lighting ceremony.

The Deacons are responsible for the Christmas Tea which is usually the second Sunday afternoon in Advent later in the day. This is a festive celebration of some Christian aspect of Christmas in which many of our congregation participate. The Fellowship Hall is decorated with the Christmas theme for the year. Cookies, cheeseballs and crackers are served with spiced tea and hot chocolate. A program follows the fellowship time with carols and speakers who talk about Christmas. It's a fun time of family, friendship and thoughts of Christ's Birth. A memory garden of poinsettias appears the week before Christmas. The plants are donated in memory of loved ones who have gone to Glory. The Deacons also help the pastor with any part of the worship services on a Sunday morning as needed.

The Mission Board collects for the Church's Christmas Card project. Families participate by donating what they'd spend on postage to send cards to people of the church. All participating families' names are signed in the card which is mailed to all in the church. Proceeds go to the special interest missionaries. During the month of December, including the Christmas Eve service, they will receive the Retired Ministers and Missionaries Offering (RMMO) which provides thank you checks to retired ordained ministers and commissioned missionaries who have devoted 15 years or more to ABCUSA as well as surviving spouses. Mission also provides 25 boxes of Thanksgiving and another 25 boxes of Christmas dinners to those who are in need of meals for the holidays.

The Board of Trustees assist the ABWM ladies in decorating the church. They set up the trees and wreaths that provide extra greenery for the holiday. They also put up tables where needed for the other activities going on. They provide the muscle for the moving of furniture.

Christian Education initiates many activities like Christmas Caroling to our shut-ins. They usually have a time for Christmas activities for the children so that parents may do some much needed Christmas shopping. Sometimes small gifts of eatables are given to the shut-ins. They allow the Kid'z Khoir practice time for their holiday participation.

Most of these traditions are prepared behind the scenes at the church. But all are based on some Biblical theme from the Bible. They are Christ centered activities to emphasize the true meaning of Christmas, the birth of Christ. We wish all the happiest of Christmas and blessings this season brings to all.


