
Dear Church Family,

News From the Board of Christian Education



The Board of Christian Education has identified the need to include children in a dedicated Bible study while the parents' attend Wednesday evenings. Therefore, the Bible Verse Club is a class intended for children ages 5 to 12, where they can learn and memorize Bible verses, and engage in Bible activities. This class will be starting on Wednesday, October 1st, from 6:45 PM to 8 PM. It has been developed to promote children's Bible literacy, which includes developing skills to interpret scripture, understand its narrative, and its relevance to personal faith and practice, fostering their spiritual growth. Also, it provides parents with peace of mind while they are attending Bible study on Wednesday evenings, knowing their children are well taken care of in a safe place.

Each week Shoeboxes will be available in the Narthex starting <u>Sept 7</u> with literature on how to pack the box and what you can put in your shoebox.
